



PERSONAL EXPENSES

As noted in your contract drinks with meals, gratuities, laundry, select meals (where noted) and other personal expenses are not included in your package. A good starting point to calculate your cash needs is \$50 per person per day. We have compiled this list of expenses so that you can better budget your incidental costs. Costs are average.

Soda and Bottled Water	\$2 per drink
Beer and Wine and Mixed Drinks (House Brands)	\$5-7 per drink
Laundry Service at lodges	\$1-3 per item of clothing (price varies based on item)
Lunch (Arusha, Zanzibar or Stone Town)	\$10-20 per person (without drinks)
Dinner (Arusha, Zanzibar or Stone Town)	\$15-25 per person (without drinks)
Tips: There is no right or wrong answer when it comes to tipping. It is a very personal thing and sometimes a hotly debated topic in online travel forums. We would prefer not to offer tipping guidelines. However, most travelers ask us for our advice. The guidelines below intentionally leave the door open for a lot of discretion. You should tip whatever makes you feel comfortable and whatever makes sense to you.

~ Cook on Camping Safari	Some people feel that it is appropriate to tip a camping cook a little less than the safari guide and some may prefer to tip roughly the same.

~ Activity Guide (for a hike, canoe, etc...)	\$20-40 for the group
~ Service Tip at lodges and tented camps (central tip box)	\$5-10 per person per day
Safari Guide tips are preferred in USD and usually given at the end of the safari. Tanzania shillings may be preferable for workers who live a distance from town (such as those at lodges and camps).	

Reminder: You should always take care with your cash and valuables. Many people always keep their cash on them instead of leaving it in the room. Many lodges have room safes and when they don't have them lodges will often keep valuables locked upon request at the front desk.

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
